___Concurrent Session: VOCA Grants presented by Kelly McIntosh

The United States Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime directly oversees the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funds that are provided annually to each state in the U.S. VOCA funds are designated to be used in states to address the needs of victims of crime and to contribute to public safety efforts and enhancements. Since 2015 the Montana Board of Crime Control has worked to implement a comprehensive Victim Services Network.

In this presentation, the roles and responsibilities of the authorities assigned to distribute and manage the VOCA funds will be described, the vision and priorities for victim services in MT will be reviewed and the process for which potential applicants can apply will be discussed.

Drew MacLeod has a deep background working with at risk youth and adventure programming. Originally from Minnesota he came to Montana after working with Native American youth in South Dakota. Drew worked for many years in outdoor experiential programs in Montana, South Carolina and Colorado. Drew and his wife, Kat, a Montana native, moved back to Billings in 2011. He joined CASA of Yellowstone County in 2013 as Program Coordinator, eventually becoming the Program Director. Along the way he served two youth as a volunteer CASA.

> Cindy Basnett, is the Advocacy Program Manager of CASA for Kids, Flathead County and has been with CASA since 2007. She began as a volunteer and loves supporting advocates in improving outcomes for children. She maintains balance spending time in the great outdoors with her family and friends.

> Cindy began working with CASA for Kids Advocate mentor program in 2008. Over time she transformed that program into our current CASA Coach program which is a variation of the Peer Coordinator model.
